
- 1. Be Kind.

GRADES



Academic Achievement Academic Practice

There will be a minimum of two academic achievement grades and seven academic practice grades per six weeks. NOTE: A "Z" in the place of a grade denotes that an assignment was not turned in on time and you did not receive credit. A "O" in the grade book means that you completed the assignment, but did not do it correctly.

- 1. **Warning**: the teacher provides a verbal reprimand/reminder to student.
- 2. **Parent Contact**: discussion with parent about student behavior.
- 3. **Detention**: 25 minute detention before or after school and parent contact.
- 4. **Referral to Administration**: a student will be immediately referred to administration for severe behavior problems.



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LATE / INCOMPLETE WORK



ABSENTEE POLICY



All work is due when requested. Failure to submit work at that time means the work is late. Students must print and assemble their papers BEFORE class begins, not during the class period. Should you have problems printing at home, plan to arrive early to use the school printers. Students will not be allowed to leave class to print work. In some cases, work will be submitted to turnitin.com. Work must be submitted by the start of class or it will be considered late. Any **academic practice** assignments will be accepted up to one day late with a 30-point deduction. Any **academic achievement** assignments turned in late will be accepted up to two days late with a 30-point deduction the first day and a 50-point deduction the second day, and on the 3rd day (or later) it will not be accepted. **Projects and writing** assignments that are done over a period of time are due on the due date regardless of absences or other circumstances.

School policy states that a student will be allowed the number of days absent plus one additional day to complete make-up assignments. However, the student is expected to complete pre-announced work on time, and long-term assignments such as process papers or projects will still be due on the due date. Work missed during a planned absence, such as a UIL activity or a school field trip, is the responsibility of the student and is due when the rest of the class turns in the work. Work due on the day of a planned absence must be turned in on or before the due date, or it is considered late. If you are absent, check the absent bin for class assignments and homework and ask me about any questions you have. Regardless of the circumstance, make-up work is always the student's responsibility.

TECHNOLOGY



CSISD is a BYOD district. Therefore, students will be allowed to bring phones, laptops, iPads, etc. to class and use them with **teacher permission**. Repeat violations of this will result in parent notification and detention(s). Appropriate use of technology is here to help us learn, not prevent us from doing so.

CHEATING 🚫

School policy states that a grade of zero may be given for work on which a student has cheated. I will also contact parents and assign an office referral. Cheating includes such acts as copying during a test, sharing answers or test questions with other students, copying information on any assignment in which an individual grade is given or plagiarizing. There are three types of plagiarism: word for word plagiarism - exact words are repeated; paraphrase plagiarism - using basically the same words as the author with a few words changed; spot plagiarism - the writer uses the original source's key words and/or phrases. Cheating will not be tolerated in this class.

EXTEND-A-BUCKS
